

How Many Children in Illinois Have Special Health Care Needs? January 2021 Update

- 557,386 children or 19.4% of children in Illinois have special health care needs per the 2018-19 National Survey of Children's Health: http://childhealthdata.org/browse/survey/results?q=5423&r=1
- 16,000 children were served by Illinois' Title V CYSHCN program –UIC-Specialized Care for Children (DSCC) in 2019. 2.8% of IL CYSHCN served by DSCC in 2019:
