

SNAP -Emergency Allotments End February 28, 2023 -Need Help?

SNAP is the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program that used to be called Food Stamps. SNAP helps low income people buy the food they need for good nutritional health. If you qualify for SNAP, you will get an Illinois Link card. Each month, the amount of your SNAP benefits will be added to your Link Card account, and you can use it like a debit card to pay for food at most grocery stores.

Beginning 03/01/2023, all active SNAP households and active Victims of Trafficking Torture and Serious Crimes (VTTC) <u>will only</u> receive their regular monthly benefit amount as determined under regular SNAP policy based on the eligibility factors of household size, income, and deductions.

The SNAP Emergency Allotments which added a minimum of \$95.00 to each household's monthly benefit will be eliminated.
