

## Resources while on a waiting list

If your child has health insurance through All Kids (Illinois Medicaid) you may have called your Medicaid Managed Care Plan to find an Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) provider after getting a prescription from you child's pediatrician or specialist.

ABA therapy is a listed Medicaid benefit prescribed for children of all ages who have a diagnosis of autism.

Currently, ABA therapy coverage through any of the State's Medicaid Managed Care companies may be difficult to locate and may involve waiting lists but this should be changing as Advocates passed state legislation that will now require Illinois Medicaid (HFS) to allow Behavior Analysts (BCBA or Board Certified Behavior Analysts) to practice ABA therapy without a licensed supervisor to oversee their work. This supervision requirement was the biggest barrier families faced when trying to access ABA because there were not enough supervisors to meet the demand.

## What can you be doing while searching for a Medicaid ABA provider?

Work with your child's school to ensure that the communication, social and behavioral concerns that may impact your child's education are addressed and included in the IEP.

Discuss alternative options with your child's pediatrician, primary care physician, speech and language professional while looking for a Medicaid ABA provider or on a waiting list with a provider. For example, you may find social skills groups, special recreation programs via a local park district, picture exchange systems, and/or social stories are helpful:
